Granagh Ballingarry Ease into first B Final since 2018



West Junior B Football Championship semi-final Granagh/Ballingarry......3-13 Athea......1-8

Granagh/Ballingarry recorded a comfortable victory over a gallant Athea second string in ideal conditions at St. Kierans GAA club grounds in Coolcappa on Sunday afternoon to qualify for their first West Limerick Junior B Football Championship Final since they defeated Dromcollogher/Broadford 3-11 to2-9 in the 2018 decider, after a replay at Mick Neville Park Rathkeale against 2019 champions neighbours Knockaderry this Saturday 23rd October

in Athea at 3.30p.m. The game was played in ideal conditions in front of a small crowd on a top class pitch with John McGrath of Monagea in charge. Wides were exchanged before Athea No. 11 Andrew O'Riordan kicked a smashing goal on 3 minutes before white flags were traded from open play by Granagh/Ballingarry No. 11 Cathal O'Keeffe on 4 minutes and Athea's No. 5 Michael Tierney a minute later to three between the sides, Athea 1-1, Granagh/Ballingarry 0-1 on 5 minutes. Then Denis O'Connor of Granagh/Ballingarry reduced the deficit to two with his second white flag from open play on 7 minutes before white flags were traded from open play by Athea No. 13 Kevin O'Keeffe on 9 minutes and Granagh/Ballingarry No. 12 Jack Hartnett 3 minutes later to leave two still between the sides, Athea 1-2, Granagh/Ballingarry 0-3 on 12 minutes. Aidan Corry split the uprights from a placed ball on 14 minutes to extend the Athea boys' advantage to three, 1-3 to 0-3 a the end of the first quarter. On the resumption of play white flags were t4raded from open play by Cathal O'Keeffe on 16 minutes and Sheehan a minute later to leave three again between the sides, Athea 1-4, Granagh/Ballingarry 0-4 on 17 minutes. A couple of wides were exchanged before a Denis O'Connor 45 was finished past Athea keeper Colin Broderick by Brendan Lynch on 20 minutes followed up by a pair of white flags from open play through Denis O'Connor on 24 and 19 minutes to send the Granagh/Ballingarry boys in at the interval leading by two, 1-6 to 1-4.



Granagh/Ballingarry dominated the opening 8 minutes after the interval with white flags through Jack Hartnett on 32 and 34 minutes, Denis O'Connor on 36 minutes followed by a Jack O'Donoghue green flag a minute later to leave eight between the sides Granagh/Ballingarry 2-9, Athea 1-8 on 37 minutes. Andrew O'Riordan finally opened the Athea boys' second half account when he split the uprights from placed balls on 39 and 40 minutes before Jack O'Donoghue raised his second green flag for the Granagh/Ballingarry boys a minute later to leave the boys from Knockfierna 9 ahead, 3-9 to 1-6 on 41 minutes. A couple of wides were exchanged before white flags were traded by Brendan Lynch from open play on 43 minutes and Andrew O'Riordan from a placed ball on 45 minutes to leave 9 between the sides, Granagh/Ballingarry 3-10, Athea 1-7 at the end of the third quarter at the second water break. When play got under way again Andrew O'Riordan, his fourth white flag for Athea from a placed ball on 47 minutes to reduce the deficit to 8. The final 13 minutes were all Granagh/Ballingarry with a trio of white flags through Jack O'Donoghue from open play on 50 minutes, Denis O'Connor from a placed ball on 55 minutes and Edward Sheehy from open play on 59 minutes. At the final whistle Granagh/Ballingarry were worthy 11 point winners, 3-13 to 1-8. They now qualify for their first West Junior B football championship final since 2018, against the 2019 winners Knockaderry on Saturday 23rd October in Athea at 3.30pm.

Granagh/Ballingarry scored 3-12 from play and 0-1 from a free. Athea scored 1-3 from play and 0-5 from frees.

Granagh/Ballingarry seek 5th Junior B football title

Granagh/Ballingarry will be hoping to take the Jim McCarthy Memorial Cup home for the sixth time when they flex their muscles against neighbours Kockaderry in the eagerly awaited West Junior B Football Championship final this Sautrday 23rd October in Athea at 3.30pm. This is the climax of the 2021 West Junior B Football Championship. It is the 37th final since Feenagh/Kilmeedy beat Granagh in the first one in the centenary year in 1984 to become the first winners of the Dr. Jim McCarthy Memorial Cup. Tremendous support is anticipated for both clubs as Knockaderry will be all out to avenge the opening round group 2 one point defeat by the boys from Knockfierna.
