Third League Win for Granagh/Ballingarry

2021 West Limerick and County Junior B Football champions (and Munster replay finalists v Rendal Óg Cork on Saturday 14th 14th May in Knockaderry at 2.30pm) extended their unbeaten run of games to eleven since defeating Knockaderry 1-12 to 1-11 in the opening round of the 2021 West Junior B Football Championship at Newcastlewest on Wednesday 18th August with an impressive 16 point 2-13 to 0-3 victory over a gallant St. Senan's second string 15 to record their third straight win in the West Junior A Football League/Championship played in dry cold conditions at Ballingarry on Thursday April 21st to go joint top of the table on six points with St. Kieran's. A small crowd turned out to watch this third round league played on a top class pitch with Mike Sexton of Bruree in charge who deputised for the appointed referee who failed to show and played 25 minutes per half due to the 35 minutes late start. Granagh/Ballingarry were sharper, more direct and showed better touches up front were too strong for their second-string opponents despite being forced to line out minus a number of first team players. The home side led by six 0-7 to 0-1 at the interval. Four of the Granagh/Ballingarry opening half flags came from the boot of Aaron Smith, 1 play, 2 frees, 1 45, two from open play by team captain Cathal O'Keeffe and one from Keith O'Kelly. Glin's only reply came from the boot of Michael Sheehy.

Granagh/Ballingarry continued to dominate after the interval with white flags from open play through Cathal O'Keeffe and Edward before the first green flag of the game came on 37 minutes through Brian Mulqueen to leave it, 1-9 to 0-1 in favour of the boys in black and green. Credit to the Glin boys who refused to give up as they continuously took the fight to their much stronger and fitter opponents and were rewarded with a pair of white flags through substitute Ger Lyons from open play to reduce the deficit to nine, 1-9 to 0-3 at the end of the third quarter. The final quarter was all Granagh/Ballingarry with four unanswered white flags from open play through Cathal O'Keeffe (two), Brian Mulqueen and Jack O'Donoghue followed by a late Keith O'Kelly green flag. At the final whistle the 2021 West and County Junior Football champions and Munster replay finalists Granagh/Ballingarry were comfortable 2-13 to 0-3 winners of their third straight win in the West Junior A Football League/Championship to join St. Kieran's at the top of the League/Championship table on six points and can now look forward to their much delayed 2021 Munster Club Junior B Football Championship Final replay against Randal Óg, Cork on Saturday 14th May in Knockaderry at 2.30pm. Granagh/Ballingarry scored 2-10 from play 0-2 from frees and 0-1 from a 45. Glin scored all 0-3 from play.

Defibrillator Group Meeting Tonight

The Granagh-Ballingarry Defibrillator Group was set up in 2007 following on from an open meeting which was attended by 50 plus people. The group fundraised locally and were in a position to purchase four defibrillators which are in place at O'Grady Spar shop, Ballingarry, Granagh-Ballingarry GAA grounds, in Ballingarry O'Gorman's shop, Chawkes Cross, Granagh and the Rock Bar, Granagh. Training courses were arranged in the use of the defibrillators. The group continued to provide regular training sessions until the pandemic restrictions made it impossible. Over the years the Group numbers have dwindled as happens with many groups. The Group have continued to maintain the defibrillators, checking batteries and pads and replacing as necessary. Thankfully none of the defibrillators have needed to be used over the 15 years. Now there are only 2 of the Group left from the original group. A relaunch is now necessary. Now that restrictions are thankfully lifted, it is a good time to start up again. There is to be a community meeting in the GAA clubhouse in Ballingarry on Wednesday 27th April at 8pm. Accommodation For Ukrainian Refugees

The GAA in partnership with the Irish Red Cross is calling on its members to register on the charity's website any accommodation suitable for housing Ukrainian refugees arriving in Ireland.

The GAA community across the world has rallied in response to the humanitarian crisis caused by the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Members have organised fundraisers and collections of goods and supplies while clubs and counties have opened their doors to welcome them, while many have been relocated in the various communities.

However, the available of appropriate housing remains a priority for the Irish Red Cross who are handling offers of accommodation. If you have or are aware of a vacant and habitable (i.e. ready to be used) apartment or house close to schools and services in your club area can you or the owner make an offer of that accommodation to the Red Cross at registerofpledges.redcross.ie

While the Irish Red Cross is still welcoming available rooms in a family home, such offers require that all persons age 16 plus already living the house to be vetted, thereby delaying the speed at which the accommodation is freed up (unfortunately existing GAA garda vetting is not applicable).

The Irish Red Cross has also stressed the vital role that the GAA community is providing by extending a warm welcome to refugees being homed in communities across Ireland.

This was echoed by GAA President Larry McCarthy who said, "While the shelter of a home is essential and I encourage all members to register any available accommodation, the welcome we extend is just as important in helping to buffer our Ukrainian visitors from the trauma of war and displacement.

The GAA community response to the war in Ukraine has been heartening. If you are aware of any refugees having been housed in your community let them know that they are welcome in your local GAA club. Clubs are reminded that if they are hosting welcome days or introductory sessions for refugees the GAA Risk & Insurance department should be notified. If games/activities are involved the wearing of mouthguards and helmets (for hurling) is required as is compliance with the Code of Behaviour.

The GAA Ard Comhairle and Coiste Bainistiochta agreed recently to make a contribution of €100,000 to the work of the Irish Red Cross in supporting Ukrainian refugees. To register available accommodation in the 26 counties.
