

WILLIE GRIFFIN INSPIRES ADARE TO SECOND LEAGUE WIN

West Senior Hurling League/Championship Round 5

Adare.....1-20

Granagh/Ballingarry.....0-15 There was much to admire about the performance of Willie Griffin wearing the No. 14 jersey for Adare who stylishly and systematically dismantled the resistance of Granagh/Ballingarry by scoring 1-11 of which 1-5 came from open playing Adare's eightpoint victory over gallant Granagh/Ballingarry to record their second win in the West Senior Hurling League/Championship in difficult wet conditions in Ballingarry on Tuesday 17th May.

A good crowd turned out to watch this fifth-round league tie despite the wet conditions played on an excellent pitch with David Deady of Bruree in charge. Holders Adare made all the early running with a pair of white flags from open play through John Fitzgibbon, Sam Hickey in the opening two minutes before white flags were traded from open play through Cathal O'Keeffe on three minutes and David O'Mahoney on four minutes, John Fitzgibbon (play) on five minutes and Cathal O'Keeffe (free) a minute later to leave it 0-4 to 0-2 in favour of Adare on six minutes.

The next six minutes was all Adare with a trio of white flags through John Fitzgibbon, two (play and lineball) and Willie Griffin (free) to leave it Adare o-7, Granagh/Ballingarry 0-2 on 11 minutes.

Cathal O'Keeffe won a point back for the home side from a placed ball on 13 minutes before Adare's No. 14 Willie Griffin showed his class when he finished past Granagh/Ballingarry keeper Keith O'Kelly on 14 minutes and then white flags were traded by Cathal O'Keeffe (play) on 15 minutes and Willie Griffin (free) two minutes later Adare 12-8, Granagh/Ballingarry 0-4 on 17 minutes.

A couple of wides were exchanged before white flags were traded by Cathal O'Keeffe from a placed ball on 22 minutes and John Fitzgibbon from open play on 24 minutes before a pair of white flags for the visitors from open play through John Fitzgibbon on 26 minutes and two minutes later to leave Adare nine ahead 1-11 to 0-5 on 28 minutes. Granagh/Ballingarry, far from being overawed, had a point from a placed ball by Cathal O'Keeffe on 30 minutes to reduce the deficit to eight, Adare 1-11, Granagh/Ballingarry 0-5 at the interval.

Willie Griffin had a pair of white flags (free and play) for the Adare boys in the opening three minutes after the interval cancelled out by Darragh Casey from open play on 34 minutes and Cathal O'Keeffe from a placed ball on 35 minutes before white flags were traded by Willie Griffin from a 65 on 36 minutes and Luke Flynn from open play a minute later to leave it 1-14 to 0-9 in favour of the Adare boys on 37 minutes. Then Cathal O'Keeffe of Granagh/Ballingarry with a trio of white flags from placed ball in a sixminute spell reduced the deficit to five on 43 minutes before white flags were traded by Willie Griffin from a placed ball on 44 minutes and Luke Flynn from open play a minute later to leave five again between the sides, Adare 1-15, Granagh/Ballingarry 0-13 at the end of the third quarter.

After three minutes of scoreless play white flags were traded by Willie Griffin from open play on 49 minutes, Cathal O'Keeffe from a placed ball on 51 minutes, Cathal O'Keeffe from a placed ball on 51 minutes and Willie Griffin from a placed ball on 53 minutes before a trio of white flags (1 play 2 frees) courtesy of Man of the Match, Willie Griffin, brought his tally for the game to 1-11, to leave Adare worthy winners of their second brace of points in the West Senior Hurling League/Championship by eight points, 1-12 to 0-15 to stay in contention for a semi final spot and Granagh/Ballingarry last year's defeated finalists have made their exit from the com-
