Group 1 Round 2

ranag/Ballingarry got their County U19B hurling Championship campaign off to a winning start with an impressive victory over a gallant Dromcollogher/Broadford at Ballingarry on Friday evening.

A good crowd watched this U19 tie played on an excellent pitch with Kieran Flaherty of Monaleen in charge. Darragh Casey raised a green flag and Michael Russell and when the play got underway again the home side Granagh/Ballingarry in the opening three minutes before points were traded by Cillian Cahill from a placed ball on four minutes and Seán Murphy from open play on six minutes, Cillian Cahill from a placed ball on seven minutes and Eoin Lynch from open play two minutes later to leave it 1-3 to 0-2 in favour of the home side Granagh/Ballingarry on 9 minutes. A couple of wides were exchanged before a pair of white flags for the home side through Michael Russell from a placed ball on 13 minutes and Eoin Lynch from open play two minutes to leave the Granagh/Ballingarry boys six ahead, 1-5 to 0-2 at the end of the first quarter at the water break. When play resumed Michel Russell had white flags for Granagh/Ballingarry from open play on 16 and 18 minutes cancelled out from placed balls by Cillian Cahill on 19 and 20 minutes to leave six again between the sides Granagh/Ballingarry 1-7, Dromcollogher/Broadford 0-4. Both sides were guilty of inaccurate shooting in the next five minutes before Granagh/Ballingarry's No. 11 Michael Russell finally found the range with a pair of white flags from a placed ball on 26 minutes and opening play three minutes later to send the home side in at the interval leading by eight, 1-9 to 0-4.

The Dromcollogher/Broadford boys made a good start to the second half with a pair of white flags through Cillian Cahill from a placed ball on 32 minutes and Adam Cotter from open play on 35 minutes before points were traded from open play by Seán Murphy on 37 minutes and Ed Brennan a minute to leave it Granagh/Ballingarry 1-10, Dromcollogher/Broadford 0-7 on 38 minutes. Granagh/Ballingarry dominated the next seven minutes shooting 2-5 through Michael Russell 0-4 (3 frees), Eoin Horgan 0-1 and Paudie Murphy 2-0 without reply from the visitors to leave it 3-15 to 0-7 in favour of the home side at the end of the third quarter at the second water break. When play got underway again Michael Russell extended the Granagh/Ballingarry boys' advantage with a white flag from a placed ball on 47 minutes before white flags were traded by Cillian Cahill from a placed on 50 minutes, T.J. Tierney from open play on 51 minutes, Seán Murphy from open play on 52 minutes and Cillian Cahill from a placed ball a minute later to leave it Granagh/Ballingarry 3-18, Dromcollogher/Broadford 0-9 on 52 minutes.

The final eight minutes was all Granagh/Ballingarry with points from open play by Eoin Lynch on 54 minutes, Darragh Casey at 56 minutes, Michael Russell on 56 minutes, Darragh Casey on 58 minutes, followed up a cracking Michael Russell goal on 29 minutes leaving the home side Granagh/Ballingarry worthy winners by 4-22 to 0-9 at Kieran Flaherty's final whistle to take the two league/championship points on offer and can look forward to their next game against St. Kieran's in a couple of weeks time in Coolcappa. Granagh/Ballingarry scored 4-15 from play and 0-7 from frees, Dromcollogher/Broadford scored 0-2 from play and 0-7 from frees.

Limerick's brave bid to capture a second Munster Minor Football Championship title, a first since 1956, failed when going under to Cork by seven points at Semple Stadium, Thurles on Wednesday evening after they led by a point with ten minutes remaining on the clock. This victory gives Cork their 30th title, a first since 2010 and also a clean sweep of Munster Minor and U20 Football and Hurling Championship titles in 2021.
