
# Jim (Twin) Lynch Memorial Cup Comes Home!

# **Limerick County Junior B Football Championship Final**

Granagh/Ballingarry.....0-10 Knockaderry.....0-2

Granagh/Ballingarry with a strong all round team performance took their fifth Limerick County Junior B Football Championship title, a first since 2010 to bring the Jim (Twin) Lynch perpetual memorial cup (new county junior football championship trophy) home with a deserved 8 point victory over gallant neighbours Knockaderry in ideal conditions at Pairc Caoimh Ui Luing Feenagh to remain top of the roll of honour.

The 35th Limerick County Junior B football championship final was played in front of a big crowd who gave great support to their sides played on an excellent pitch with Donncha O'Callaghan of



Feohanagh/Castlemahon in charge. Knockaderry played with wind advantage in the opening half but it was Granagh/Ballingarry who mounted the first attack and were awarded a free, kicked wide by their No. 12 Aaron Smith on the second minute. Then the Knockaderry boys from their first real attack were awarded a 30 metre free which minor star Mike Molloy sent straight between the uprights on 4 minutes cancelled out from open play by Granagh/Ballingarry's No. 14 Denis O'Connor, two minutes later for o-1 all on 6 minutes. Six minutes later after inaccurate shooting by both sides Séan Duffy split the uprights from open play to put Knockaderry one ahead 0-2 to 0-1 on 11 minutes. A couple of wides were exchanged to leave Knockaderry still one ahead at the end of the first quarter at the water break.

On the resumption of play both sides were guilty of inaccurate shooting from 6 minutes before a pair of white flags for Granagh/Ballingarry through Aaron Smith from a placed ball on 22 minutes and Damien O'Donovan from open play two minutes later to leave the west champions one ahead 0-3 to 0-2 on 24 minutes. The final six minutes of this most disappointing opening half saw both sides guilty of many handling errors and poor passing before Donnacha O'Callaghan sounded the short whistle to leave the Granagh/Ballingarry boys still one ahead 0-3 to 0-2. Granagh/Ballingarry dominated the opening 12 minutes of the second half with a trio of unanswered white flags through Cathal O'Keeffe, play, Aaron Smith, free and Denis O'Connor play, to extend their advantage to four 0-6 to 0-2 ahead at the end of the third quarter at the second water break.

The final quarter was again dominated by the west champions with white flags from open play through Aaron Smith on 47 minutes, Denis O'Connor on 50 minutes and Cathal O'Keeffe on 55 and 59 minutes without reply from the Knockaderry boys at the final whistle, Granagh/Ballingarry were worthy eight point winners 0-10 to 0-2 of their fifth Limerick County Junior B football championship title, a first since 2010 to bring the Jim (Twin) Lynch perpetual memorial cup (new county Junior B football championship trophy) home. The Knockaderry boys were gutted to have lost to the Granagh/Ballingarry boys for the third time this season but were very sporting in defeat and wished us the best of luck in the Junior A grade in 2022. Our own Munster Council delegate Seamus Twomey thanked the Lynch family for presenting the cup to the county board and congratulated Granagh/Ballingarry on winning their fifth County Junior B football championship title. He praised Knockaderry for their part in the final and wished Granagh/Ballingarry luck in the Junior A grade in 2022. He complimented referee Donnacha O'Callaghan and his officials and the Feenagh/Kilmeedy club for having everything in top class order. He then presented the cup jointly with Gramme Lynch to winning captain Niall Cahill to the joy of the large Granagh/Ballingarry support. Niall who was honoured to be their first captain to receive the Jim (Twin) Lynch memorial cup thanked manager Shane O'Grady, selectors Mark O'Sullivan and Andrew Holmes along with first aid official Theresa Noonan and special mention of injured keeper Gearóid O'Leary. Niall complimented Knockaderry and gave them three cheers.

Granagh/Ballingarry recorded their third straight win in group 2 of the County U-21 B hurling championship with an emphatic 31point victory over gallant Croom in ideal conditions on Tuesday 16th November to finish top of the group on 6 points to qualify for a quarter final meeting with group 1 second placed Knockainey on Tuesday 30th November in Kilbreedy at 8pm. A good crowd turned out to watch this game which was

played on an excellent pitch with Jonathan Hayes of St. Senan's in charge. Granagh/Ballingarry were sharper, more direct, showed better touches up front and were too strong for the neighbours. They led at half time 3-14 to 0-6. In the second half Granagh/Ballingarry continued to pile on the pressure and added 16 points to their total to two for their opponents' credit to the Croom boys who refused to give up and continually took the fight tot heir much stronger opponents.
