Poster Banning GAA Events (1916):

1916 was a pivotal year in the creation of the modern Irish state. On Easter Monday 1916 some 1,200 spectators occupied buildings across Dublin triggering a battle for what was then one of the major cities in the British Empire. Beyond the capital poorly armed rebel contingents turned out in North Dublin, Meath, Louth, Galway and Wexford. Posters were a major tool for the broad dissemination of information during the rebellion and were distributed widely to garner support, urge action, boost morale and carry warnings. This public notice poster was issued by General John Maxwell (1859-1929) at the same time that he was presiding over the execution of the leaders of the 1916 Rising, as well as extensive martial laws and the internment of thousands of men and women in the aftermath. The poster aimed to prohibit GAA matches from taking place. Although not formally involved in the 1916 Rising the GAA made a significant contribution indirectly by producing a generation of physically fit young men with nationalist views and a hostility towards the government, state, institutions and the forces of law and order. Members of the GAA were prominent in the Irish volunteers and hurls commonly appeared in

place of guns in drill and training exercises. In the aftermath of the 1916 Rising the official commission

of enquiry identified the GAA as an instigating factor in the Rebellion. The GAA leadership denied the finding and later sought to engage with the British authorities to safeguard the organisation's sporting operations. This involved the GAA exclusion from an entertainment tax and the re-introduction of special train services to matches.

Waterford Crystal Chandelier (2005):

The Waterford Crystal Chandelier was designed and created by Billy Canning (chief lighting designer, Waterford Crystal) and was installed in the players' lounge in Croke Park Stadium in 2005. The brief was to design a luminaire that reflected the game of the GAA. It consists of 32 footballs to represent each county in Ireland and 70 sliotars to represent each minute in a full championship match and suspended in mid-air as they would be in play. Using LED technology, the crystal balls and sliotars can change colour to the team colours of the winning team being hosted in the players' lounge.

The players' lounge is a private room which allows the players to unwind after the game with their teammates, friends and family. It is not used after every match but it is the tradition of the All Ireland Finals that both teams converge there afterwards to show camaraderie. The ethos of the players' lounge shows how Gaelic Games is not just a competition or a physical activity, but a sport with an important social component where teams can gather amicably in both victory and defeat.

Waterford Crystal has had many strong and tangible links with the GAA including the sponsorship of competitions, trophies, kits and youth development schemes. Most notably, the Waterford Crystal Cup was a pre-season hurling competition which began in 2006 and involved Munster County times and third level colleges. Much like the Waterford Crystal large-scale manufacturing plant in the city which closed after entering receivership in 2009, the competition ceased in 2016. It was replaced with the Munster Senior Hurling
