

Granagh/Ballingarry fought hard to bank first Munster Final spot since 2010

Five times Limerick County Junior B Football Championship winners Granagh/Ballingarry fought hard in difficult underfoot conditions in Knockaderry on Sunday when reduced to fourteen players for the final quarter due to Aaron Smith receiving a straight red card on 45 minutes to hold out to test gallant Waterford champions The Nire second string side by four points to qualify for their first Munster Club Junior B Football Championship final since going under to Na nGael Kerry by three points, 1-10 to 3-10 in the 2020 decider against Moyvane, Kerry or Randal Og Cork scheduled for Sunday 27th February in Knockaderry at 2p.m.



The Nire A football stronghold in Waterford, winners of both the County Senior and Junior B football championship in 2021 are very familiar with West Limerick surroundings as they also travelled to West Limerick where they went under to the home side Newcastle West in the quarter final of the Munster Senior Club football championship on Saturday 4th December.

A good crowd watched this Munster Junior B club championship semi-final played in heavy underfoot conditions with Eamonn Moran Kerry in charge. Prior to the start of the game a minute's silence was observed in memory of former Ballingarry club players John Skipper Scanlon and Peadar Daly. The Waterford champions The Nire with the wind at their backs started the better, but failed to convert early chances before Cathal O'Keeffe of Granagh/Ballingarry found the range with a well taken point from open play on 5 minutes.

The standard of football in the next 13 minutes were poor with both sides guilty of inaccurate shooting hampered no doubt by the difficult underfoot conditions. Then an Aaron Smith free from Granagh/Ballingarry was flicked to the back of The Nire net by Denis O'Connor to leave the Limerick champions four ahead, 1-1 to 0-0 on 19 minutes. Then Shane Walsh finally opened the Waterford champions' account when he split the uprights from a placed ball on 21 minutes cancelled out from open play by Séan O'Connor two minutes to restore the Granagh/Ballingarry boys four point 1-2 to 0-1 advantage on 22 minutes. The next seven minutes saw both sides guilty of inaccurate shooting before Connie Power finally found the range for The Nire boys when he split the uprights from a placed ball on 29 minutes to reduce the deficit to three, Granagh/Ballingarry 1-2, The Nire 0-2 at the short whistle.

Granagh/Ballingarry dominated the opening 13 minutes of the second half with five unanswered white flags, Aaron Smith (free) on 32 minutes, Jack Cagney (play) on 35 minutes, Aaron Smith (free) on 39 minutes, Jack Cagney (play) on 41 minutes and Cathal O'Keeffe (play) five minutes later to extend their advantage to eight 1-9 to 0-2 on 43 minutes. Then the game turned in The Nire favour when the Granagh/Ballingarry boys were reduced to fourteen player when their scorer in chief Aaron Smith received a straight red card on 45 minutes and 1-2 frees from placed balls by Connie Power in the a three minute spell reduced the deficit to three, Granagh/Ballingarry 1-7, The Nire 1-4 on 40 minutes. A couple of wides were exchanged before The Nire No. 11 Conor Power got inside the Granagh/Ballingarry defence only to be denied an equalising goal by an inspired save by Granagh/Ballingarry keeper David Clancy on 55 minutes. Livelier on the ball and more willing to attack Granagh/Ballingarry dominated the final five minutes to seal a four point 1-8 to 1-4 victory with a well taken point from play Denis O'Connor two minutes from time to book their place in the Munster Club Junior B Football Championship final for the first time since going under to Na nGael by three points, 1-10 to 3-1 in the 2010 decider against Moyvane, Kerry or Randal Og Cork on Sunday 27th February in Knockaderry at Granagh/Ballingarry scored 1-6 from play and 0-2 from frees. The Nire scored all 1-4 from frees.

Granagh/Ballingarry GAA Club membership fees for 2022 are now due and are €40 for adult players (€120 with club draw), €20 for students and non players €15 for Bord na nOg (€120 per family). JOHN (SKIPPER) SCANLON R.I.P.

A great old Gaelic games enthusiast player and supporter died on Wednesday 9th February. The late John was an outstanding hurler and master of the No. 7 jersey winning two West Limerick Junior A hurling championship medals with Ballingarry in 1966 and 1969. John went on to achieve further success in winning two All Ireland Junior Hurling Championship medals with Warwickshire in 1969 and 1973. John's death is sincerely regretted by all in Granagh/Ballingarry and to his wife Kathleen, sons, daughters, grandchildren, brothers, sisters, son-in-law, nephews, nieces, other relatives and friends. PETER (PEADAR) DALY R.I.P.

Granagh/Ballingarry GAA club officials, players and members extend its sympathies to the Daly and Dunworth families, Ballingarry on the death of Peter (Peadar) Daly, Tuamgraney, Clare and formerly of Ballingarry. Peadar was one of four Daly brothers along with Pat, Maurice and Liam to represent our club with distinction over the years. Peadar won a West Limerick minor hurling championship medal with Granagh/Ballingarry in 1958 along with his brother Pat. Peadar was a member of the Limerick minor hurling team in 1960 who were beaten by Tipperary. In 1964 Peadar joined the Garda Síochána and was part of the Young Irelands team that beat UCD to win the Dublin County Senior Hurling Championship Final. Peadar played in Croke Park with the Garda Síochána against The Army scoring 5 goals on one occasion. Peadar lined out with the Limerick senior hurlers in 1967 and was part of the great Ballingarry team that won the West Limerick Junior A hurling championship title in 1969. Peadar moved to Clare and continued to play and support Bodyke GAA club before finally retiring at the age of 53. Peadar made one final cameo when he lined out age 57 with his two sons Conor and Gordon, when the team were short a player Peadar had the distinction of playing competitive hurling across five decades in the 50s, 60s, 70s, 80s and 90s.
