Registration will take place outside the Rock Bar, Granagh from 9am to 11am

The team that completes the course which takes about two hours with the fewest pucks will win the King of the Hill perpetual trophy. We introduced a family competition in 2013 with a team of three or two members of the same family with the fewest pucks winning a family section perpetual trophy. It is the perfect way for mothers and fathers to play with their sons and daughters and have fun along the way.

Roll of Honour

The Kilmallock team of Eoin Ryan, Andrew O'Shaughnessy Seoirse Bulfin won the first contest in 2009 with a creditable score of fifty-three shots. Tied for second place were the Pallasgreen team of Denis, Ciarán and second Glen Ryan and the Bllyguile team of Billy and Liam O'connor and Shane Mulcahy. Thirty-two teams completed the course in 2010 and the local team of Pat Carroll, Mick O'Rourke and Mark Tierney won with forty-five shot. Joint second with sixty-nine were the Kilmallock 2009 winning team of locals Eoin Cahill, Evan Fox and Niall Cahill and twenty-seven teams completed it in 2011. The winners were the local Craigacurra team of David Condron, Gerry O'Donovan and his son Thomas with thirty-eight pucks. Joint second on thirty-nine were the Bruff line stakers Shane Mulqueen and Billy and Liam O'Connor and the Coolruss team of Niall Carroll, Patrick Potter and James Noonan.

The local power ranger's team of cousins Willie Power and John and Conor O'Keeffe took the bronze with forty shots. Thirty teams completed the course in 2012 in difficult wet and wintry conditions and it was won again by Kilmallock fielding Andrew O'Shaughnessy, Eoin Ryan and Billy O'Loughlin with forty-nine shots. Second on fifty-one were the local team of Denis O'Connor, Damian O'Donovan and Mickie O'Keeffe. The local Spar team of Donal and Darragh O'Grady and Michael Corrigan were third with fifty-two. Thirtynine teams completed the course in ideal conditions in 2012 won by the local Kilatal boys' team of Stephen Hickey, Jack O'Donoghue and Edward Sheehy on forty-six second on forty-seven were the Larry Murphy team of Mick O'Keeffe, Damian O'Donovan and Denis O'Connor and joint third on forty-nine shots, Willie and Jack Banks and Darragh O'Grady and the always cut home team of Darren and Shane Clifford and Noel O'Grady. In the family section the winners were Fiona, David and Aisling Herlihy and third on fiftynine were Bill Cagney and John and Sean English. In 2014 thirtyfive teams completed the course in difficult windy conditions and it was won by the locals Seamus, Peter and Stephen Stapleton on fifty-one shots, joint second on fifty-two were the Adare Bandits Michael, Andrew and Stephen O'Connell and the local Brian Geary Ltd team of Mick O'Keeffe, Denis O'Connor and Damien O'Donovan.

The bronze medals went to the Bruff Liners Billy O'Connor his son Liam and Shane Mulcahy on fortysix shots. The best team of Claire, Eoin and Siobhán Enright won the third annual family section with forty-three shots, one behind the adult section winners, second on fifty-four shots were the 2014 winners the Liam McCarthy team of John, Sean and Claire English and the Lynch Mob team of noel, Gearóid and David Lynch. In 2016 thirty-six teams completed the course, a decrease of two teams on 2015. The adult contest was won by the Mighty Morrissey team of David, Fiona and Emma Morrissey with a very creditable score of forty-two shots, close second on forty-three were the Henry Street Garda team of Denis O'Connor, Damien O'Sullivan and Mike O'Keeffe. Four teams finished level on forty-five shots. The local Sliced Pan team of David, Cathal and Kieran O'Keeffe the team of Thomas O'Donovan, David Condron and Colm Noonan, the Bruff Liners Shane Mulqueen, Billy O'Connor and his son's team and the Snipers team of Kieran Mulqueen, Josh Mulcaire and Brian O'Shea, the Butler/Stapleton team of Kayleigh, Jessie and Beth Stapleton won the fourth annual family section with forty-eight shots. Close second on forty-nine were the Kilmichael Warriers team of James Flynn his son Luke and cousin Darragh Casey. In third place with a very creditable score of fifty-two shots were the Glengille team of Fiona Power and Laura and Ann Marie O'Keeffe. In 2017 a record fortyfive teams completed the course an increase of nine on 2016. The adult competition was won by the Wilson Warriors team of Richie junior, Richie senior and Cathal O'Keeffe with a very creditable score of forty-two shots, the same as the 2016 winners. The Mighty Morrisseys tied second on forty-four with the Ballyguile Whistle Blowers team of Denis O'Connor, Damien O'Donovan and Mike O'Keeffe and the Murphy Peas team of Kieran O'Donovan, Patrick Shelton and Seán Lenihan. The bronze medals went to the Lis-

moate Ramblers brothers Niall and Eoin Cahill and Evan Fox. The Snipers team of Kieran Mulqueen, Ryan O'Shea and Josh Quill won the fifth annual family section with forty-two shots, the same number as the adult section winners, close second on forty-three were the Kilmare team of Claire, Eoin and Siobhán Enright with a very creditable score of fifty-one shots were the Kinglands team of Seamus, Paudie and Sean Murphy. A record fifty-one teams completed the course in 2018 an increase of six on 2017. Joint first adult competition winners were the team of Denis O'Connor, Mikey O'Keeffe and Damian O'Donovan along with Eoin Herlihy and Michael Russell with forty-two shots. Clare, Eoin and Siobhán Enright won the sixth annual family section for the second time, a first since 2015 with fortytwo shots the same number as in 2017 winners Kieran Mulqueen, Ryan O'Shea and Josh Quill and the adult section winners. A record fifty-two teams completed the course last St. Stephen's Day an increase of one on 2018.
