Third Win Books Semi Final Spot

Limerick County Junior a Football Championship Group 2 Round 5

Granagh-Ballingarry 0-14 Hospital-Herbertstown 0-12

A pair of points from open play courtesy of substitute Kevin Forde and Josh Quelle Mulcare on 58 and 59 minutes paved the way for a third staright win for Granagh-Ballingarry in group 2 of the Limerick County Junior A Football Championship with a hard fought two-point over a gallant Hospital-Herbertstown at windy Paddy Carroll Memorial Park, Ballagran on Sunday afternoon to finish level in the group on 6 points with Camoge Rovers, Hospital-Herbertstown and Ahane to qualify for the semi final. Camoge Rovers for the quarter final against Ballybricken Bohermore and Hospital-Herbertstown and Ahaneplay-off for the second quarter final spot as a result of a draw made by the C.C.C Michael Browne of Dromcollogher-Broadford took charge of this final group 2 County Junior A Football Championship tie played in front of a small crowd on an excellent pitch. The Hospital-Herbertstown boys with the wind at their backs won possession from Michael Browne's throw-in and their no.13 Ronan Magee kicked wide before points were traded from open play by Paudie Murphy and Michael Whelan for 0-1 each on 3 minutes.

Then Cian McCoey on 4 minutes and Luke Flynn on 6 minutes raised white flags from open -play for Granagh-Ballingarry before points were traded from play by Mickey Bob Ryan on 11 minutes and Brian Sheehy a minute later to leave the Granagh Ballingarry two ahead 0-4 to 0-2 on 12 minutes. Wides were exchanged before points were traded by Ronan Magee (free) on 15 minutes and Paudie Murphy (play) on 17 minutes, Cathal O'Keeffe (free) 18 minutes and Michael Whelan (play) a minute later to leave it 0-6 to 0-4 in favour of Granaghy Ballingarry on 19 minutes.

The Hospital-Herbertstown boys with the wind at their backs now began to up their game with a trio of unanswered white flags in a six minute spell through Conor O'Grady (play) on 20 minutes, Dylan O'Connor (play) on 22 minutes and Ronan Magee (free) three minutes later to leave the boys in red and black one ahead 0-7 to 0-6 on 25 minutes. Then the game was held up for three minutes due to injury before points were traded from open play by Cathal O'Keeffe on 29 minutes and Conor O'Grady on 30 minutes to leave the South division side still one ahead. Wides were exchanged before the Hospital-Herbertstown boys finished the opening half strong with a pair of white flags from open play through Ronan Magee and Michael Whelan in added time to go into the interval leading by three 0-10 to 0-7. Granagh Balingarry no.11 Jack Cagney reduced the deficit to two when he split the uprights following a good solo run in the opening minute after the interval before Hospital-Herbertstown keeper brought off two top class saves to keep his side in the Game. Granagh Ballingarry with the wind at their backs dominated for 13 minutes with four unanswered white flags through Cathal O'Keeffe (free) - Paudie Murphy, Cathal O'Keeffe and Cian McCoey (play) to leave the Knockfierna boys two ahead 0-12 to 0-10 at the end of the third quarter.

Then Granagh Ballingarry keeper brought off two top class saves before the Hospital Herbertstown boys finally opened their second half account with points by Ronan Magee (play) on 49 minutes and Conor O'Grady (free) three minutes later to leave the sides level for the fourth time at 0-12 each on 52 minutes. Both sides were guilty of inaccurate shooting in the next five minutes before a pair of white flags from open play for Granagh Ballingarry through substitute Kevin Forde on 58 minutes and Josh Quelle Mulcare a minute later to leave last years Junior B Champions Granagh Ballingarry two ahead 0-14 to 0-12 on 59 minutes.

The Hospital Herbertstown boys created a number of goal scoring chances in added time which they failed to convert against a solid Granagh Ballingarry defence to leave the boys in black and green still two ahead but only just 0-14 to 0-12 at the finish after a most enjoyable hard fought contest to finish level in group 2 of the Limerick County Junior A Football Championship on 6 points with Camogue Rovers, Hospital Herbertstown and Ahane to qualify for the semi final. Camogue Rovers for the quarter final against Ballybricken-Bohermore and Hospital Hebertstown and Ahane play-off for their second quater final spot as a result of a draw made by the CCC on Monday. Granagh Ballingarry score 0-12 from play and 0-2 from frees, Hospital Herbertstown scored 0-9 from play and 0-3 from frees.

West Junior B Hurling Championship Semi Final (Preview)

Saturday 1st October in Páirc Caoimh Uí Luing, Feenagh at 5pm sees the eagerly awaited clash of Granagh/Ballingarry and neighbours Croagh/Kilfinny in the semi final of the West Limerick Junior B Hurling Championship. Granagh/Ballingarry will be aiming to reach their sixth final in seven seasons and their first since 2020 when defeating Feohanagh/Castlemahon 0-11 to 0-10 in Dromcollogher on Friday Friday 25th June 2021 and the Croagh/Kilfinny boys their first since 1980 when they received a walkover from Kilcornan. Both sides are in Friday's semi final on merit after playing a lot of good hurling on the way. Croagh/Kilfinny finished top of Group 2 on 4-point ahead of Knockaderry on scoring difference and went straight through to the semi final.
