WEST JUNIOR A FOOTBALL LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL

GRANAGH-BALINGARRY 1-13 St. KIERANS 2-9 2021 West and County Junior B Football Championship and defeated Munster finalists Granagh-Balingarry with a strong all-round team performance took their third West Junior A Football Championship title a first since defeating Feohangh-Castlemahon 2-8 to 1-10 in the 2016 decider at Séan Finns Park, Rathkeale on Sunday 17th September with hard fought one point victory over a gallant St.Kierans second string side in ideal conditionsat Mark Neville Park, Rathkeale on Monday evening. A good crowd attended this hell contested West Junior A Football Championship Final.

It was played on an excellent pitch with John McGrath Monaghea in Charge. St Kieran's with the wind at their backs made all of the years rumours with a well taken second minute white flag courtesy of their number 13 Conor Woulfe. A couple of wides were exchanged before a trio of white flags from open play for the boys in black and green courtesy of Denis O'Conor on 4 minutes. Cathal O'Keeffe on 6 minutes Cian McGory two minutes later to leave Croagh-Balingarry two ahead 0-3 to 0-1 on 8 minutes. Ben Luke O'Flynn cut through St.Kierans defence only to his kick for goal go horribly wide before white flags were traded from open play by Brian Crowley on 10 minutes and Cian McGory on 12 minutes to leave Granagh-Ballingarry sail two ahead then after after five minutes of scoreless play the first green flag of the final arrived through Brian Crowley to leave the St. Keirans on ahead for the second time 1-2 to 0-4 on 18 minutes Cathal O'Keeffe and Séan Murphy had wides for Granagh-Ballingarry before a pair of white flags for St.Keirans from placed balls this upon Pa O'Sullivan on 21 minutes and Brian Crowley on 23 minutes were cancelled out from open play by Luke Flynn on 25 minutes and Paudie Murphy two minutes later to leave St.Keirans still one ahead 1-4 to 0-6 on 27 minutes. A couple of wides were exchanged before Granagh-Ballingarry No.11 Aaron Smith split the uprights from a place ball on 30 minutes to send the sides in at the interval level St. Kierans 1-4 Granagh-Ballingarry 0-7.

The opening two minutes of the second half belonged to Aaron Smith of Granagh-Ballingarry with a cracking good following a good solo run followed up by a pointed free to leave the 2021 West and County Junior B Championship far ahead 1-8 to 1-4 on 32 minutes Ben O'Sullivan won a point back from a placed ball on 33 minutes before before points were traded from open play by Cian McGorey on 35 minutes and Brian Crowley two minutes later to leave three between the sides. Granagh-Ballingarry 1-9 St.Kierans 1-6 on 37 minutes. Wides were exchanged before Aaron Smith extended the Granagh-Ballingarry boys advantage to four when he split the upright from a placed ball on 40 minutes.

The St.Keirans boys far from averaged raised their second green flag through Anthony Molyneaux on 49 minutes before white flags were traded from open play by Micheál Flynn on 45 minutes and sub Keith O'Kelly on 47 minutes Anthony Molyneaux on 49 minutes and Luke O'Flynn on 51 minutes to leave one between the sides Granagh-Ballingarry 1-12 to St.Keirans 2-8 with nine minutes of normal time remaining on the clock.

Then after five minutes of scoreless play Paudie Murphy cut through the St. Keirans defence and split the uprights to extend Granagh-Ballingarry boys advantage to two 1-13 to 2-8 on 56 minutes. Then Anthony Molyneaux reduced the deficit to one when he split the uprights from a played ball on 59 minutes. The St.Keirans boys created a couple of scoring chances in the field, exciting minutes, which they failed to convert to leave Granagh-Ballingarry at the final whistle, if only just one point 1-13 to 2-9 winners of the third West Junior A Football Championship title, a first since defeating Feonagh-Castlemahon also by 9 points 2-8 to 1-10 in the 2006 decider a victory that also see them qualify for a meeting with South League Championship winners and defeated County Junior A Football Championship Finalists Comogue Rovers in the County Junior A Football League semi-final on the Saturday 18th June in Kilbeheny at 7pm.Granagh-Balingarry scored 1-10 from play and 0-3 from free's St.Keirans scored 2-5 from play and 0-4 from free's.

Granagh-Ballingarry recorded a comfortable victory over a gallant St. Senan's second string side at windy Dromcollogher on Thursday evening to qualify for their first West Limerick Junior A Football Championship final since defeating Feohanagh-Castlemahon by a point 2-8 to 1-10 in the 2006 decider on Sunday 17th September at Sean Finns Park, Rathkeale to qualify for a final meeting with St. Kieran's who defeated Ballysteen 4-2 after penalty shot in the second semi final at Ballyhahill. The game was played on an excellent pitch in front of only seven spectators with John Hunt of Athea in charge. St. Senan's won the toss and elected to play with the aid of the wind in the opening half but it was the Granagh-Ballingarry boys who made all the yearly running with a pair of white flags courtesy of David Condr

on and Cathal O'Keeffe in the opening four minutes. Wides were exchanged before referee John Hunt awarded St. Senan's a penalty which Maurice Fitzgerald sent past Granagh-Ballingarry keeper David Clancy to leave the Saints one ahead, 1-0 to 0-2 on six minutes. The next nine minutes were close and exciting with white flags traded by Dominic Kearns (play) on eight minutes and Aaron Smith free on 10 minutes, Aaron Smith (play on 11 minutes and Dominic Kearns (free) on 13 minutes and David Condron a second from open play two minutes later to leave Senans still one ahead 1-3, 0-5 at the end of the first quarter.

A couple of wides were exchanged before the Granagh-Ballingarry boys began to up their game with a trio of white flags from open play through team captain Cathal O'Keeffe on 18 minutes, Paudie Murphy on 21 minutes and Darragh Casey on 24 minutes before white flags were traded by Dominic Kearns from a placed ball on 26 minutes but a second from open play by Paudie Murphy two minutes later to leave Granagh-Ballingarry two ahead o-9 to 1-4 on 28 minutes. Wides were exchanged before Cathal O'Keeffe landed his third white flag from open

play for Granagh-Ballingarry one minute into added time to send the 2021 West and County Junior B champions Granagh-Ballingarry in at the interval leading by three, 0-10 to 1-4.

Granagh-Ballingarry with the wind at their backs dominated the opening seven minutes after the interval, shooting 1-4 from open play though Darragh Casey 1-1, Aaron Smith, Cathal O'Keeffe and David Condron 0-1 to leave Granagh-Ballingarry ten ahead, 1-14 to 1-4 on 37 minutes. Then after five minutes scoreless play, white flags were traded by Gerard Hanlon from open play on 43 minutes and Aaron Smith from a placed ball two minutes later to leave the Granagh-Ballingarry boys still ten ahead 1-15 to 1-5 at the end of the third quarter. The sub Brian Mulqueen extended the Granagh-Ballingarry advantage to eleven when he raised his third white flag from open play on 47 minutes.

The St. Senan boys far from being overawed had a cracking Niall O'Connor goal to reduce the deficit to eight, 1-15 to 2-5 on 50 minutes. Then after five minutes of scoreless play, Cathal O'Keeffe on 56 minutes and Cian McGaey on 58 minutes added on white flags from open play for Granagh-Ballingarry before Dominic Kearns of St. Senan's split the upright from a placed ball on 60 minutes. At the final whistle the 2021 West and County Junior B champions Granagh-Ballingarry were comfortable nine points 1-18 to 2-6 winners to qualify for their first West Junior A Football Championship Final since defeating Feohanagh-Castlemahon by a point 2-8 to 1-0 in the 2006 decider on Sunday 17th September at Sean Finns Park, Rathkeale to qualify for a final meeting with St. Kieran's on Monday 13th June in Mick Neville Park, Rathkeale at 7.30pm.
