Who will be the first winners of the Jim (Twin) Lynch Memorial

Will Granagh/Ballingarry or neighbours **Knockaderry be the first winners of the (Jim)** Twin Lynch Memorial Football Cup when they meet in the eagerly-awaited Limerick County Junior B Football Championship Final this Sunday 21st November in Pairc Caoimh Ui Luing, Feenagh at 2.30p.m. in a rematch of the record West Final won 1-11 to 1-6 by Granagh/Ballingarry at Athea.

PREVIEW

This is the climax of the 2021 County Junior Football Championship and the 34th final since Monagea won the first won in 1986. Tremendous support is anticipated for both clubs as Granagh/Ballingarry contest their sixth final bid for a fifth title after wins by Ballingarry in 1989 and Granagh/Ballingarry in 1996, 2002 and 2010 and Knockaderry contest their fourth final seeking a fourth title with wins in 1988, 1999 and 2006. The trophy they are playing for is the Jim (Twin) Lynch perpetual memorial football cup presented to the Limerick County Board by the Lynch family, Granagh. The late Jim (Twin) Lynch had a life long association with the GAA with the Granagh/Ballingarry club and was at the time of his sudden passing on Tuesday 28th May 2019 the assistant secretary of the West Limerick GAA Board. Jim and his twin brother John were vital part of the Granagh/Ballingarry successful underage teams in

1976, 1978 and 1980 and Jim also captained the side to take U-16 honours in 1978 and minor in 1980. He had a great love for gaelic football and served as a football selector when Granagh/Ballingarry won the West Jun8or A championship honours in 1990 and 1996, West A Football League in 2003 and 2007, West Junior B Championship and League 1996 and 2010 and County Junior B Football Championship 1996, 2002 and 2010.

In difficult wet and windy conditions at Athea on Saturday 23rd October with only one point separating the sides following a cracking Kieran Storin goal for Knockaderry on 55 minutes, which was cancelled out two minutes later by second half substitute Luke Flynn following a long solo run and a well taken point by Denis O'Connor on 59 minutes paved the way for a hard fought 5 point victory for Granagh/Ballingarry over gallant Knockaderry to take their sixth West Limerick Junior B football championship title and a first since 2018 to go joint top at the roll of honour with Knockaderry. Limerick County Junior B Football Championship semi-final

Granagh/Ballingarry 3-13, Claughaun 0-2. Newly crowned West champions Granagh/Ballingarry recorded a comfortable victory over gallant city champions Claughaun at Ballybrown GAA club grounds in Clarina on Saturday afternoon to qualify for their first Limerick County Junior B football championship final since going under to Dromcollogher/Broadford by a point in 2018 at Knockaderry against Knockaderry ??????? this Sunday 21s November in Pairc Caoimh Ui Luing, Feenagh at 2.30p.m. in a rematch of the recent West final won 1-11 to 1-6 by Granagh/Ballingarry at Athea.

A small crowd watched this county championship semi-final hampered no doubt by the live coverage of the Ireland v All Blacks rugby game on tv played in heavy underfoot conditions with Trevor Mann of Ballybrown in charge. Granagh/Ballingarry were guilty of five wides to one for Claughaun in the opening 5 minutes before Damien O'Donovan of Granagh/Ballingarry finally found the range when he split the uprights on six minutes. Aaron Smith and Cathal O'Keeffe had wides for Granagh/Ballingarry before a well taken point from long range by Denis O'Connor 10 minutes later and a cracking Edward Sheehy goal following a good solo run four minutes later to leave Granagh/Ballingarry five ahead, 1-2 to 0-0 at the end of the first quarter at the water break. On the resumption of play it was all Granagh/Ballingarry again with 5 unanswered white flags from open play through Jack Cagney on 17 minutes, Cathal O'Keeffe on 19 minutes, Denis O'Connor on 21 minutes, a second from Cathal O'Keeffe on 23 minutes and Jack Cagney two minutes later to leave it 1-7 to 0-0 in favour of the West Limerick champions on 25 minutes. A couple of wides were exchanged before Ben O'Shaughnessy finally opened the Claughaun account with a well taken point from play on 29 minutes to reduce the deficit to nine, Granagh/Ballingarry 1-7, Claughaun 0-1 at the inter-

Two minutes into the second half Cathal O'Keeffe finished past Claughaun keeper Tony McCarthy, to extend the Granagh/Ballingarry boys' advantage to twelve 2-7 to 0-1 on 32 minutes. Both sides were guilty of inaccurate shooting hampered no doubt by the difficult underfoot conditions in the next four minutes. Then Aaron Smith of Granagh/Ballingarry found the range when he split the uprights from a placed ball on 37 minutes before four unanswered white flags from play through Sean O'Connor on 39 minutes, Jack Cagney on 41 minutes, Jack O'Donoghue on 43 minutes and a second from Sean O'Connor on 44 minutes to extend the Granagh/Ballingarry boys' advantage to seventeen, 2-12, to 0-1. Sean Carey ended fifteen minutes without a Claughaun score when he split the uprights following a good solo run on 45 minutes to reduce the deficit to sixteen, Granagh/Ballingarry 2-12, Claughaun 0-2 at the end of the third quarter at the second water break.

The final quarter was again dominated by the West champions with a well taken point by Edward Sheehy following a good solo run and second Cathal O'Keeffe green flag without reply from the Claugaun boys at the final whistle Granagh/Ballingarry were worthy 20 point winners 3-13 to 0-2. Second Wins for U-21s County U-21 B Hurling Championship Group 2 Round 2

In difficult underfoot conditions at Garryspillane GAA grounds on Tuesday 10th November Granagh/Ballingarry made it back to back wins in group 2 of the Limerick County U-21 B Hurling Championship with a hard fought two point win over gallant neighbours Knockaderry to go joint top of the group on four points with Knockaderry top stay in contention for a quarter final spot. A small crowd turned out to watch this lively hard fought contest hampered by the long journey both sets of supporters had to make to the Knocklong venue with Michael Browne of Dromcollogher/Broadford in charge.

Sean O'Connor and Ronan Keating traded white flags in the opening two minutes before Luke Flynn split the uprights following a good solo run on 3 minutes followed by a cracking Paudie Murphy goal on 4 minutes and well taken points by Brian Sheehan a minute later to leave Granagh/Ballingarry five ahead, 1-3 to 0-1. The Knockaderry boys far from being over-awed had a point from a placed ball by Kieran Storin on 6 minutes followed by a smashing Michael Molloy goal on 8 minutes and a Kieran Storin point from play two minutes later to leave the sides at 1-3 each on 10 minutes. Both sides were guilty of inaccurate striking in the next four minutes before Michael Russell of Granagh/Ballingarry finally found the range when he split the uprights from a placed ball......

to leave the boys from Knockfierna one ahead 1-4 to 1-3 at the end of the first quarter. Having had the water break the play got underway again with white flags traded by Paudie Murphy from open play on 17 minutes and Kieran Storin from a placed ball two minutes later to leave the Granagh/Ballingarry side still one ahead 1-5 to 1-4 on 19 minutes. The Knockaderry boys now began to up their game with four unanswered white flags in as many minutes through Michael

Molloy (2 play), Kieran Storin (free) and Ronan Ceitinn (play) before points were traded by Luke Flynn from open play on 24 minutes and Kieran Storin from a placed ball a minute later to leave the Knockaderry by three ahead, 1-9 to 1-6 on 25 minutes. Then after five minutes of scoreless play Knockaderry No. 11 Kieran Storin split the uprights for the fifth time in the open half from a placed ball on 30 minutes to leave four between the sides, Knockaderry 1-10, Granagh/Ballingarry 1-6 at the interval. The opening seven minutes after the interval were close and exciting with points traded by Kieran Storin (play) and Darragh Casey (play), Michael Russell (free) and Kieran Storin (free), Kieran Storin (play) and Gearóid Lynch (play) to leave Knockaderry still four ahead 1-13 to 1-9 on 37 minutes.

Granagh/Ballingarry now began to up their game with a trio of unanswered white flags in a seven minute spell through Darragh Casey and Seán O'Connor from open play and Michael Russell from a placed ball to reduce the deficit to one, Knockaderry 1-13, Granagh/Ballingarry 1-12 at the end of the third quarter at the second water-break. When play got underway again Kieran Storin cut a line-ball between the uprights to extend the Knockaderry boys' advantage to two, 1-14 to 1-12 on 47 minutes. Granagh/Ballingarry dominated the next ten minutes with four unanswered white flags in a ten minute spell through Paudie Murphy and Seán O'Connor (play), Michael Russell (free) and Eoin Lynch to leave the boys from Knockfierna two ahead, 1-16 to 1-14 on 57 minute.
