IMPRESSIVE CROAGH/KILFINNY OFF TO A WINNING START

WEST SENIOR HURLING LEAGUE/CHAMPIONSHIP

Round 1

2021 County Intermediate Hurling Championship defeated finalists and West and County Intermediate League winners Croagh/Kilfinny got their West Senior Hurling League/Championship campaign off to a winning start with an impressive 10-point victory over neighbours and great rivals Granagh/Ballingarry on Thursday evening in dry cold conditions in Ballingarry.

A good crowd turned out to watch this first game of the year for both sides, played on an excellent pitch with John McGrath of Monagea in charge. Croagh/Kilfinny's No. 8 shot a wide from a placed ball before Granagh/Ballingarry's No. 14 Denis O'Connor opened the scoring with a second minute white flag from a placed ball.

The opening green flag of the game arrived in the 3rd minute through Croagh/Kilfinny's No. 11 Brian Hannon before white flags were traded from open play through Croagh/Kilfinny's No. 15 Andrew Meade on four minutes and Granagh/Ballingarry's No. 11 Cathal O'Keeffe two minutes later to leave it 1-1 to 0-2 in favour of Croagh/Kilfinny on six minutes. Both sides were guilty of inaccurate shooting in the next six minutes before the Croagh/Kilfinny boys' second green flag arrived through their No. 13 Barry Lenihan on 13 minutes before a pair of white flags for the home side through David Condon on 14 minutes and Denis O'Connor from a placed ball a minute later reduced the deficit to three, 2-1 to 0-4 at the end of the third quarter.

The visitors extended their advantage to five through a pair of white flags by former all-star Seamus Hickey on 17 minutes and Brian Hannon on 20 minutes before points were traded by Damien O'Donovan (play) on 21 minutes and James Lanigan (free) on 22 minutes. Josh O'Connor (play) on 23 minutes and Denis O'Connor (play) two minutes later to leave five between the sides Croagh/Kilfinny 2-5, 0-6 on

The final five minutes of the opening half was all Croagh/Kilfinny with a trio of white flags from open play through Nessan leading on 26 minutes, Andrew Meade on 28 minutes and Barry Lenihan on 30 minutes to leave the visitors in at the interval leading by eight, 2-8 to 0-6.

Brian Hannon had a white flag for the Croagh/Kilfinny boys in the third minute after the interval to extend their advantage to nine. The game was held up for the next five minutes due to injury of a trio of Croagh/Kilfinny players who were forced to leave the field of play due to leg injuries. When play resumed Croagh/Kilfinny's No. 14 Denis O'Connor finished past the Croagh/Kilfinny keeper David Lynch to reduce the deficit to seven, Croagh/Kilfinny 2-10, Granagh/Ballingarry 1-6 on 40 minutes. Then Brian Hannon extended the visitors' advantage to eight when he split the uprights following a good solo run on 41 minutes. The game was held up for the next five minutes dur to injury to a number of players and when play resumed white flags were traded by Eoin Casey from a long range placed ball on 47 minutes and Tom McMahon from a placed ball on 48 minutes before a pair of white flags for Croagh/Kilfinny through substitute Cian O'Carroll from a placed ball on 50 minutes and open play on 52 minutes were cancelled out from open play by Michael Russell on 53 minutes and substitute Josh Quill Mulcaire on 54 minutes before white flags were traded by Denis O'Connor from a placed ball on 56 minutes and Brian Hannon from open play a minute later to leave it 2-15 to 1-10 in favour of Croagh/Kilfinny on 57 minutes. Then a trio of white flags from open play through sub Padraig O'Gorman on 58 minutes, John Wall on 60 minutes and substitute Cian O'Carroll on 62 minutes before Denis O'Connor had a late consolation point from a placed ball for Granagh/Ballingarry on 64 minutes and at the final whistle Croagh/Kilfinny were worthy ten-point 2-18 to 1-11 winners of the two West Limerick Senior Hurling League/Championship points on offer. Second League Win for Granagh/Ballingarry West Junior A Football League/Championship

Round 2

Granagh/Ballingarry3-15

St. Senan's.....0-4 Granagh/Ballingarry fresh from their thrilling draw with Randal Óg Cork in the Munster Junior B Football Championship final at Knockaderry on Saturday 26th March extended their unbeaten run of games to eight since defeating Knockaderry 1-12 to 1-11 in the opening round of the 2021 West Junior B Football Championship at Newcastlewest on Wednesday 18th August with an impressive twenty-point 3-15 to 0-4 over a gallant St. Senan's second string 15 to record their second win in the West Junior A Football League/Championship at sunny Ballingarry on Tuesday 29th March. A small crowd turned out to watch this second round league tie played on a top class pitch with John McGrath of Monagea in

Granagh/Ballingarry were sharper were direct and showed better touches up front, were too strong for their opponents despite being forced to line out minus a number of first team players.

The home side led by six, 0-8 to 0-2 at the interval. Six of the Granagh/Ballingarry opening half white flags came from the boot of Aaron Smith (2 play 3 frees 1 45) and one each from Paudie Murphy and Keith O'Kelly. Senan's replied from the boot of Michael Sillery and Kevin Doody. Granagh continued to dominate after the interval with white flags through substitute Kevin Forde, Aaron Smith (free), Jack O'Donoghue and substitute Jack Hartnett without reply from the St. Senan's boys to extend their advantage to ten, 0-12 to 0-2 at the end of the third quarter.

The game was ended as a contest early in the final quarter with a trio of green flags for the home side courtesy of Jack O'Donoghue and Kevin Forde (two), followed up by a trio of white flags through David Condron, substitute Cian McHoey and Paudie Murphy to leave it 3-15 to 0-2 in favour of the Granagh/Ballingarry boys on 55 minutes. Credit to the St. Senan's boys who refused to give up and continuously took the fight to their much stronger and fitter opponents were rewarded with a pair of white flag flags courtesy of Francis Farrell and Michael Sillery resulting in a penalty which Granagh/Ballingarry saved from Dom Cienan's at the final whistle. The 2021 West and County Junior B Football champions and Munster finalists Granagh/Ballingarry were comfortable 3-15 to 0-4 winners of their second straight win in the West Junior A Football League Championship to join Ballysteen at the top of the League/Championship table on four points and can now look forward with confidence to their Round 3 game against Glin on Saturday 17th April in Ballingarry at 6.30pm and the much delayed 2021 Munster Club Junior B Football Championship Final replay against Randal Óg, Cork in Knockaderry.

At the final whistle Rathkeale were eight-point 2-13 to 0-11 winners to join Askeaton at the top of the West Junior A Hurling League/Championship table on three points.
