KNOCKFIERNA GAELS AGM 30 YEARS AGO IN 1992

Thirty years ago, Granagh/Ballingarry/Ballingarry (Knockfierna Gaels) GAA Club held its third AGM on Friday 10th January 1992 in the clubhouse, Ballingarry, where there was a contest for the position of chairman between outgoing Mossie O'Connor and Jimmy Stapleton with a tie result of 22 votes each with Mossie O'Connor re-elected on the casting vote of vice chairman. Seán Kennedy and John Lynch were elected as the new club secretary in place of John English who did not seek re-election after two years in the position. Chairman Mossie O'Connor presided and welcomed everyone. Present were 44 delegates.

Outgoing secretary John English read the minutes of the previous AGM of 2nd February 1991 and gave a detailed report on all the club activities of 1991 both on and off the field.
