



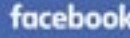

Granagh Ballingarry Book Quarter Final Spot with Croom



Limerick County Intermediate Hurling Championship Group 2 Round 4

Granagh Ballingarry 0-30 Kilmallock 2-16

Granagh Ballingarry recorded their fourth straight win in group 2 of the Limerick County Intermediate Hurling Championship with a deserved eight-point win of a gallant Kilmallock second string side at sunny Paddy Carroll Memorial Park, Ballyagran on Saturday afternoon to finish second in the group on 8 points, two behind neighbours Croagh-Kilfinny to qualify for a quarter final meeting with neighbours Croom in Saturday 8th October in Croagh at 3.30pm. John O'Halloran of Bruree took charge of this final group 2 county intermediate hurling championship tie played in front a good crowd on an excellent pitch.

Granagh Ballingarry made all the yearly running with four white flags in as many minutes through Josh Quill Mulcare and Paudie Murphy (play), Damien O'Donovan (free) and Cathal O'Keeffe (play) before Conor Staunton opened the Kilmallock boys account when he split the uprights following a good solo run to leave 0-4 to 0-1 in favour of Granagh Ballingarry boys on 5 minutes. Then white flags were traded from open play by Conor Staunton on 6 minutes and Cathal O'Keeffe on 7 minutes to leave three still between the sides. The game was held up for three minutes due to injury to Granagh Ballingarry no.15 Paudie Murphy who was forced to leave the field of play. When play got underway again Kilmallock had a trio of white flags from open play through Conor Staunton on 11 minutes, Dylan O'Brien on 13 minutes and Conor Staunton on 15 minutes to leave the sides level at 0-5 each at the end of the first quarter.

Granagh Ballingarry now began to up their game with seven unanswered white flags on eight minutes spell through Jack Camoy (play), on 16 minutes, Luke Flynn (play) on 17 minutes, sean O'Connor (play) on 18 minutes, Damien O'Donovan (free) on 19 minutes and Luke Flynn (2 play) on 20 and 22 minutes and Donal O'Grady (play) on 23 minutes to leave the boys from Knockfiarna seven ahead 0-12 to 0-5. The Kilmallock no.11 Conor Staunton of Kilmallock split the uprights from a placed ball on 25 minutes to leave the boys to reduce the deficit to six before four unanswered white flags for Granagh Ballingarry through David Condron (play) on 26 minutes Damien O'Donovan (free) on 27 minutes Jack Cagney (play) on 29 minutes Damien O'Donovan (free) 30 minutes to increase the boys in black and green advantage to ten 0-16 to 0-6. Conor Staunton from a placed ball and cathal O'Keeffe from open play traded white flags in added time to send the Granagh Ballingarry boys in at the interval still ten ahead 0-17 to 0-7.

The opening ten minutes after the interval saw white flags traded by Conor Staunton (free) and Damien O'Donovan (free) twice, and Conor Moloney (play), Brian Daly (play) and Josh Quelle Mulcare (play) before a pour of white flags from open play for Granagh Ballingarry through substitute Michael Russell on 42 minutes and Cathal O'Keeffe a minute later to leave it 0-23 to 0-11 in favour of the black and greens on 43 minutes. Then points were traded by Conor Staunton (free) on 44 minutes and Luke Flynn (play) on 45 minutes Damien O'Donovan (free) on 46 minutes and Conor Staunton (free) on 47 minutes before a pair of white flags for the Kilmallock boys through Conor Staunton (free) on 49 minutes and substitutes TJ Hanley (play) two minutes later to leave ten between the sides Granagh Ballingarry 0-25 Kilmallock 0-15 on 51 minutes. Then Cathal O'Keeffe extended the Granagh Ballingarry boys advantage to eleven when he split the uprights from long range on 52 minutes before the first green flag of the game arrived courtesy of Kilmallock. No. 22 TJ Hanley on 533 minutes and conor Staunton followed up a minute later with a white flag from a placed ball to reduce the deficit to seven.

Granagh Ballingarry 0-26 Kilmallock 1-16 on 54 minutes. Then Cathal O'Keeffe from open play on 55 minutes and Damien O'Donovan from a placed ball on 57 minutes raised white flags for the Granagh Ballingarry boys before Paudie O'Dwyer raised the Kilmallock boys second green flag on 60 minutes to reduce the deficit to six Granagh Ballingarry finished strong with a pair of white flags in added time courtesy of Damien O'Donovan to bring his tally for the game to 10 points from frees and Daragh Casey from open play. At the the final whistle the boys in black and green were worthy eight point 0-30 to 2-16 winners of their fourth straight brace of points in group 2 of the Limerick county Intermediate hurling championship to finish second in the group on 8 points 2 behind neighbours Croagh Kilfinny to qualify for a quarter final meeting with neighbours Croom on Saturday 8th October in Croagh at 3.30pm. Granagh Ballingarry 0-20 from play and 0-10 from frees. Kilmallock scored 2-9 and 0-7 from frees.

GRANAGH BALLINGARRY book semi final spot

West Junior B Hurling Championship Semi Final Granagh Ballingarry1-15 Tournafulla 1-12

In ideal conditions at Newcastle West on Sunday evening Granagh Ballingarry recorded a hard fought 3 point victory over gallant Tournafulla to qualify for the semi final of the west limerick junior b hurling championship against neighbours Croagh Kilfinny. A good crowd turned out to this qater final clash of two fine sporting junior b sides played on an excellent pitch with Geroid McCarthy of Templeglantine in charge. Wides were exchanged before Korey Keogh of Tournafulla opened the scoring with a third minute white flag from a 65 both sides were guilty of inaccurate shooting before points were traded from open play by Brendan Lynch on 7 minutes and Bobby Mulcahy a minute later to leave it 0-2 to 0-1 in favour of the Tournafulla boys on 8 minutes. Eoghan O'Connell and Sean O'Donnell had wides for Tournafulla before four unanswered white flags for Granagh Ballingarry in an eight minute spell through Jim O'Keeffe (2 play) and Eoin Lynch (free and 65), to leave the boys in black and green three ahead 0-5 to 0-2 on 18 minutes. Then a pair of white flags for the

Tournafulla boys courtesy of Korey Keogh from open play on 20 minutes and a placed ball on 22 minutes were cancelled out by Jim O'Keeffe from open play on 23 minutes and Eoin Lynch from a placed ball a minute latr to leave Granagh Ballingarry still three ahead 0-7 to 0-4 on 24 minutes. Then Eoin Enright extended the Knockfiarna boys advantage to four when he split the uprights from a long range placed ball on 26 minutes before points were traded from placed balls by Eoin Lynch on 28 minutes and Korey Keogh on 30 minutes to leave four between the sides. Granagh Ballingarry 0-9 Tournafulla 0-5 at the interval.

Eoin Lynch and Korey Keogh traded white flags from placed balls in the opening two minutes after the interval. Then Brian sheey on 34 minutes and Brain Mulqueen on 46 minutes had white flags from open play for Granagh Ballingarry before Korey Keogh landed his fifth white flag from a placed ball for Tournafulla on 40 minutes to leave five between the sides Granagh Ballingarry 0-12 Tournafulla 0-7. Then after three minutes of scoreless play green flags were traded by Jim O'Keeffe on 44 minutes and Korey Keogh a minute later to leave still five between the sides. Granagh Ballingarry 1-12 Tournafulla 1-7 at the end of the third quarter. Wides were exchanged before white flags were traded from open play by Jim O'Keeffe on 47 minutes and Sean O'Donnell on 48 minutes Owen Lynch on 50 minutes and Korey Keogh on 51 minutes before a placed ball of white flags from placed balls by Korey Keogh on 53 and 55 minutes to reduce the deficit to three 1-14 to 1-11 with five minutes of normal time remaining on the clock. Brian Sheehy from open placed ball on 58 minutes and Korey Keogh from a placed ball on 60 minutes to bring his tally for the game to 1-10 (1-2 from play 0-7 frees 0- 65). The Tournafulla boys created a number of goal scoring chances and added time which they failed to convert against a solid Granagh Ballingarry defence to leave the boys in black and green three ahead but only just 1-15 to 1-2 at the final whistle after a most enjoyable hard fought contest to qualify for a clash with neighbours croagh Kilfinny in the the semi final of the west junior B hurling championship in a couple of weeks time. The Tournafulla boys were gutted to have lost by three points but were a very sporting in defeat and wished the Granagh Ballingarry boys the best of luck in the semi final against neighbours Croagh Kilfinny. Granagh Ballingarry scored 1-9 from play 0-5 from frees and 0-1 from a 65. Tournafulla scored 1-4 from play 0-7 from frees and 0-1 from a 65.
