Granagh/Ballingarry bid for Munster Football Glory on Saturday

Knockaderry is the venue on this Saturday 26th March at 2.30p.m. for the eagerly-awaited meeting of five times Limerick County Junior B Football Championship winners Granagh/Ballingarry and Cork kingpins Randal Og in the much delayed 2021 Munster Club Junior B Football Championship Final.

Preview

Tremendous support is anticipated for both clubs in this the 13th final in the competition since Clann na nGael Cork won the first one in 2006. Randal Og will be contesting their first final and hoping to become the second Cork club on Saturday to win the title since Clann na nGael in 2006. Their opponents Granagh/Ballingarry reached the decider in 2010, where they went under to Na nGael Kerry by three points, 1-10 to3-11, and will be hoping to become the second Limerick club to raise the Munster Club Junior B Football Championship trophy since Ballybrown caused a major shock by lowering the colours of much-fancied Cromane from Kerry in the 2017 decider.

RANDAL OG

The Randal Og club is a Junior B hurling and football club, centred in Ballincarriga, South east of Dunmanway town in the heartland of Carbery, the South West GAA Division of County Cork. Ballinacarriga and the surrounding townlands comprise of a quiet rural area of West Cork, an area dominated by a 16th century castle built on a towering rock no more than a few hundred metres from the Randal Og O Mirthile, local Gaelic chieftain and from whom the club takes its name.

In the other direction, less than a mile to the north, the River Bandon flows by on its way to the Atlantic ocean at Kinsale Harbour. The Randal Og club was founded in 1953 as a football club only. In 1996 a hurling team was affiliated for the first time and since then there has been no break in the club's dual commitment. The club now field Junior B and Under 21 teams in hurling and football. The club are involved in underage games, up to and including minor, as part of the Sam Maguires club. 2021 was a dream year for Randals as the club won two County Junior B football titles (including their first ever County B Championship title) as well as the Carbery Junior B crown.

Their reward is a deserved place in Saturday's Munster Club Junior B Football Championship final against Granagh/Ballingarry from West Limerick and a spot in the Cork County Junior A football ranks for the first time in over 40 years in 2022. The average age of the Randal Og players is 23 to 24 between football and hurling, they played an energy-sapping 28 games in 29 weeks across eight different competitions, and they finished the 2021 season with three trophies and promotion to Junior A Football in 2022

Randals is one of the smallest clubs in the Carbery division. They didn't have a huge pick of players and likewise don't have a huge pick of voluntary people either but who ever can get involved will get involved. It's all the way from the people involved in the administrative side to all the people involved with the teams, its everyone who helps out in their own way. The Randals are only a crossroads really, they have a school, church, local creamery. The GAA club is hugely important to areas, when the teams are doing well, more and more people came to the matches. The Randal Og GAA club officials are hopeful there will be even more supporters at the games this season and the footballers hope to be crowned Munster Junior B Champions on Saturday and strut their stuff at Junior A and the hurlers redouble their efforts to win promotion from Junior B.

Granagh/Ballingarry

Granagh/Ballingarry GAA club is situated in West Limerick under the shadow of Knockfierna. The club cater for all ages from under 6 to adult in both hurling and football. Formed in 1945, reformed in 1990 after the merger between Granagh and Ballingarry GAA clubs previously the clubs had been playing together at under age level. Hurling is the more popular game in the parish, winning West and County championship titles in all grades from senior down

to U-12. Since 1989 the club has enjoyed great success in football, winning five County Junior B football championship titles, one county Junior B League title, six West Junior B championship titles, two West Junior A championship titles, two West Junior A league titles and two West Junior B League titles along with numerous West and County titles from U-21 right down to U-12.

2021 was a very successful year for Granagh/Ballingarry in both codes, winning seven pieces of silverware. The 2020 County U-16 13-a-side football title, the Junior B footballers achieving a West and County Championship double and their counterparts in hurling winning the delayed 2020 West Championship title. The fine display given by the intermediate hurlers reaching the County Championship semi-final for the first time since 20-18, where they went under to eventual winners Effin by two reaching the West Senior Hurling/League/Championship final where they went under to Adare by four points at Newcastle West, winning the Jim Twin Lynch Memorial and Hennessey Cups. The U-21 hurlers with only a panel of 17 players fought a great campaign to reach the County B Final where they defeated neighbours Dromin/Athlacca 0-18 to 0-7 to capture the club's first County 15-1-a-side County U-21 hurling championship title to finally bring the curtain down on a long and successful 2021 season on Sunday 12th December at Staker Wallace GAA grounds in Kilbreedy. 2021 West Limerick and County Junior B Football champions (and Munster finalists v Randal Og Cork this Saturday 26th March in Knockaderry at 2.30p.m.) Granagh/Ballingarry made a winning start to their West Junior Football League Championship campaign with a comfortable victory over a gallant Mountcollins second string under lights in Mountcollins on Wednesday night 16th March. A good crowd turned out to watch this opening league tie despite the cold conditions, which was played on an excellent patch with Michael Browne of Dromcollogher/Broadford in charge. Granagh/Ballingarry were sharper, more direct, showed better touches up front, were too strong for their opponents despite forced to line out minus a number of first team players. The visitors led 0-8 to 0-2 at the interval. The Granagh/Ballingarry goals came from the boot of Damien O'Donovan and a hat-trick by former County minor Keith O'Kelly who finished with a personal tally of 3-5. Credit to Mountcollins boys who refused to give up and continuously took the fight to their much stronger and fitter

opponents. At the final whistle the 2021 Junior B champions and Munster finalists Granagh/Balling-arry were comfortable 4-19 to 0-8 winners of the two West Junior Football League/Championship points on offer.
